REFERENCE: INVITATION FOR QUALIFICATION FOR “GYANODAYA” PPP SCHOOLS IN RAJASTHAN (NO. F1 (14) EDU.-I/2009 DATED APRIL 15, 2010)

The Department of School and Sanskrit Education, Government of Rajasthan (“**Authority**”), vide the referred notice, had invited applications for pre-qualification for “**Gyanodaya**” PPP schools in Ajmer and Udaipur Divisions of Rajasthan. Following is the response of the Authority to the queries received on the ‘Request for Qualification’ (“**RfQ**”).
